For the third year running the rally will be open to cars with engines from Henry Meadows of Wolverhampton. Amongst some of the oldest cars attending are a 1913 Sunbeam and 1914 Star Torpedo Tourer and blazing a trail around the Museum's 26 acre site is one of the oldest commercials - a 1924 fire engine.

Wannabe Michael Schumaker's and budding Jeremy Clarkson's can image they are in the driving seat as a calvacade of classic cars transform the Museum's site into a sea of shiny chrome. All that backseat driving will have worked up a bit of an appetite and visitors can sample mouth-watering fish and chips from the 1930s Fried Fish Shop, washed down with a pint of real ale in the Bottle and Glass Inn!
